



What is the purpose of the project?


This project's goal is to test a new measure of sexual knowledge and attitudes.

Socio-Sexual Knowledge and Attitudes Assessment Tool-Third Edition

Stoelting Co. and Dr. Shelley Watson are pleased to announce the development of the **Socio-Sexual Knowledge and Attitudes Assessment Tool – Third Edition (SSKAAT-3)**, a tool to assess the socio-sexual knowledge and attitudes of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Results from SSKAAT-3 assessments can inform how to best provide relevant education about sex, sexual health, intimacy, and relationships, and ultimately support healthy sexuality, reduce vulnerabilities to abuse, and promote healthy boundaries and intimate relationships.

What is the purpose of the project?

This project's goal is to test a new measure of sexual knowledge and attitudes. The project will help us understand how this revised measure can best meet the needs of persons with disabilities.

What does participating involve?

You will be asked to take part in a one-hour interview. You will be asked to answer questions about relationships and sexuality. You will not be asked about your sexual experience, but you will be asked what you know and think about dating, marriage, and intimate activities, such as kissing and sexual intercourse.

What are the risks of taking part in this study?

This interview deals with sexual topics. You may be uncomfortable answering some of the questions during the interview.

What are the potential benefits of participating in this study?

Your participation in this study will help us better understand the sexual knowledge and attitudes of persons with disabilities. This information will allow us to create better sex education programs and supports.

For participation in this study, you will receive a \$25 VISA card. When the study is complete, you will be provided a summary of the results.

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
