The Canada FASD Conference is coming to **Toronto**, **Ontario on October 21-23**, **2025.** This national conference on FASD brings together different people from across the country and internationally who hold valuable perspectives on FASD and prevention of FASD. With over 500 attendees expected, this three-day event brings together healthcare professionals, social workers, justice and legal professionals, educators, counsellors, researchers, policy makers, and those with direct or indirect lived or living experience to connect and collaborate. Conference Theme


The theme for Canada FASD

Conference 2025 is **Shaping the Future of FASD: From Evidence to Action**

FASD touches many lives. To be successful in breaking down barriers, erasing stigma and improving wellness, we need all people and perspectives working together.

Collectively, we can shape a brighter future for people who are vulnerable.

The goal of our conference is to ensure all voices connected to FASD are provided with the opportunity to be heard. To this end, we are inviting individuals with living experience in FASD and/or alcohol use in pregnancy and affected family and friends to share their perspectives, experiences and knowledge. These personal stories can help us all better understand this disability.



Guidelines for Personal Experience Abstracts

If you would like to contribute to the conference by presenting your experience and perspectives on one of the sub themes related to FASD, please submit your presentation idea using the online submission form. All submissions are to be electronic and must be submitted by 23:59 EDT on March 31, 2025.

THINGS TO CONSIDER

We encourage different types of submissions such as posters, artwork, storytelling or other types of oral presentation. Please explain your submission in 250 words or less.

The conference audience will be researchers. caregivers and individuals with FASD, frontline service providers, professionals in social work, justice, health, education and policy makers. Example ideas include:

- the challenges and successes of providing support to those who have FASD;
- the use and impact of different types of medication;
- managing wellness strategies;
- substance use and mental health;
- stigma and discrimination;
- employment, housing or educational success;
- and alternative or new approaches to supporting people with FASD.

Translation services are minimal.

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR




Your idea should be relevant to the topic of FASD and the conference theme.




If Accepted

CanFASD will email all communications about an abstract submission to the applicant (Primary Presenter), who is responsible for distributing information to other authors or co-authors.

If an applicant accepts an offer to present, but is later unable to attend, they must make CanFASD aware of this. Presenters will be required to disclose any real or potential conflicts of interest at the beginning of their presentation or workshop, or on their poster, as well as the funder of their work.

All presenters must register for the conference and pay their registration fee by Friday, August 4, 2025. Only the Primary Presenter is eligible to recieve the speaker rate (\$749).
